

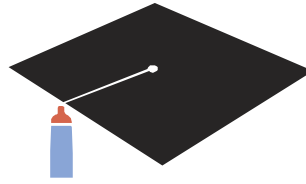
UWSPSF Mission

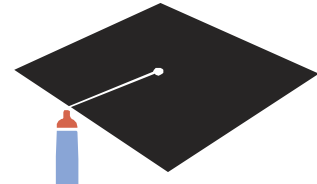
How to Support UWSPSF

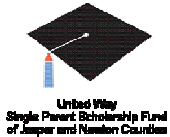

Why is UWSPSF needed?

The United Way Single Parent Scholarship Fund of Jasper & Newton Counties (UWSPSF) was established in 2006 to help impoverished single parents in our community.

Statistics in Jasper and Newton Counties show the area has a higher percentage of single-parent families below poverty level compared to the national average. These families are also headed by an individual with only a high school education.



The strategy is to work at the local level to provide incentive scholarships to those individuals who desire to earn a post-secondary degree or diploma through a college, university, or technical school program to obtain well-paying, skilled employment.

Community mentors are also available to participants to ensure that each individual stays in school and graduates.

UWSPSF was modeled after a successful program started in 1990 in Northwest Arkansas. Their fund has provided more than 11,000 scholarships statewide. Their program shows 85.5% of Single Parent Scholarship recipients remain in school or graduate – more than double the average for

Eligibility Criteria

In order to be eligible for a Single Parent Scholarship, applicants must meet the following qualifications:

- Resident of Jasper or Newton County
- High school graduate or equivalent
- Single head of household (single, separated, divorced, widowed) with custody of children under the age of 18
- Applying for or recipient of a federal Pell Grant with proof of status
- Evidence of financial need
- Pursuing a career-oriented, full-time course of study at a post-secondary institution of higher learning
