is a systematic approach to parent education through monthly home visits and monthly educational/networking meetings that provide an array of individualized and well-rounded opportunities to enhance understanding of child development as well as improvement of parenting skills with the utilization of research-based curriculum and educational programs.

## What We Do

- Increase parental understanding of child development and improve parenting skills
- Promote the physical care and well-being of the child
- Improve a child's behavioral, emotional, and social development
- Promote positive parent and child interaction
- Prevent and reduce child abuse and neglect
- Increase early childhood immunization, developmental screening, and early delay detection
- Encourage appropriate use of the health care system and medical resources to stay-at-home parent families and high-risk families
- Improve the safety of the home environment
- Delay subsequent births in teen parents
- Decrease incidences of substance and alcohol abuse and increase smoking prevention education opportunities
- Help stay-at-home parents and/or high-risk family members adapt to changing roles

## Enrollment Qualifications

- Live in Jasper or Newton Counties
- Parent of a child less than 3 years of age
- Meet income eligibility criteria
